Relationships

What types of relationships were displayed? Were they positive or negative relationships? Who was responsible for the positive and negative aspects of the relationships?

The Bible says, "Don't just pretend to love others. Really love them. Hate what is wrong. Hold tightly to what is good. Love each other with genuine affection, and take delight in honoring each other" (Romans 12:9-10, CEB) and "Do to others whatever you would like them to do to you" (Matthew 7:12, CEB).

How did the relationships you observed demonstrate those biblical principles?

Attitudes

What kinds of attitudes did the characters exhibit? How did one attitude affect another's?

In the Bible, Jesus said, "Whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant (Matthew 20:26, NIV) and "Love is patient and kind. Love is not jealous, it does not brag, and it is not proud. Love is not rude, is not selfish, and does not get upset with others. Love does not count up wrongs that have been done. Love takes no pleasure in evil but rejoices over the truth" (1 Corinthians 13:4-6, NCV).

Where did you see attitudes of love, respect, servanthood, and patience exhibited in the show?

Changes

What were the big changes that happened in the story? What or who caused those changes?

The Bible teaches, "By helping each other with your troubles, you truly obey the law of Christ" (Galatians 6:2, NCV) and the Bible also reminds us that "My salvation and my honor depend on God; he is my mighty rock, my refuge. Trust in him at all times, you people; pour out your hearts to him, for God is our refuge" (Psalm 62:7-8).

In the bad situations, who showed compassion? In the good situations, who shared the joy?

Effects

What effects did the negative situations have on people? What about the positive situations?

In the Bible, Jesus taught us, "In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world (John 16:33)" and the Apostle Paul wrote, "The Spirit produces the fruit of love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control. There is no law that says these things are wrong" (Galatians 5:22-23, NCV).

What effect can the fruit of the Spirit have on any situation?
